
The year is 1945 just after the Liberation of Paris. Gertrude Stein and her life companion, Alice B. Toklas, have returned to their apartment in the rue Christine.

Miss Stein is in a talkative mood and has agreed to meet with a few people, in this case, the audience, to reminisce, explain and perhaps to clarify her life's work in a world of the arts, in a city dedicated to the arts, in which she has as lived for sixty years.

She will say she knew “everyone who was everyone” and she proceeds to prove it—from Picasso to Matisse, to Cezanne, to Virgil Thompson to Claude Debussy to Charlie Chaplin.

2011 definitely marks an unexpected renaissance for Gertrude Stein. She is everywhere from prestigious art galleries to two page spreads in newspapers and magazines as well as lectures and musical plays and popular films. This is the year of Gertrude Stein Superstar.
