THE CARL CHERRY CENTER FOR THE ARTS

The latest exhibition at the Carl Cherry Center for the Arts features artwork by Carmel-based Malcolm Weintraub. The exhibit, Malcolm Weintraub: Sculpture 2006 – 2011, opens Friday, April 8<sup>th</sup> with a reception for the artist from 5 to 7 p.m. at the Cherry Center. At once precise and offhand, his mixed-media installations link seemingly disparate subjects within a network of associations—sometimes based on clever wordplay—that bridges ideas across eras and cultures.

Much of Weintraub's work is fueled by his fascination for language and with establishing unexpected connections between objects, places, words and people. The exhibit incorporates the startling use of materials in various media that elevate common objects like egg cartons, hay bales, whisk brooms and balls of twine-- to create newfound associations. This shifting landscape of image and idea operates on multiple levels of meaning, forming both an elaborate meditation on the way the mind assimilates information and an investigation of the connections between artistic process, philosophy, science, and pop culture.
