The Oslo-based Norwegian folk music group Feleboga will perform . . . at the Carl Cherry Center for the Arts. Feleboga repertoire includes different genres of traditional tunes, from the older, intricate listening pieces (lyderlåter) and dance tunes (slåtter) for solo hardingfele, to the newer gammeldans tunes(waltz, reinlender, polka) for hardingfele or violins and guitar.

Feleboga has performed and taught in Norway, Germany, Poland, Iceland, Thailand, and the US (Minnesota, Indiana, New York, Washington D.C.) Feleboga has recorded a CD, Snikkarvalsen, together with their fiddle mentor Salve Austenå, of gammaldans repertoire from Tovdal.
